



"Z" Great Texas Adventure - Part 1 By Brian King

Our Texas adventure began almost a year earlier. Rich and Melody have a house in Kerrville, Texas. They had been spending a lot of time there and decided to invite the chapter (Il-Z) to go with them for fantastic Texas riding. Since they knew the area, he started planning it out with daily trips into Hill County. Finally pulling the trigger and setting a date, we began our plans earnestly. 4 days there, 4 days riding, and 4 days to get home was the plan. As time progressed, I got my employer to allow two more days off, and a trip to the Rio Grande and Big Bend National Park was added. Rich planned all the routes, and March 31, 2025, was set as the day to start. Kind of early for planning a ride in Illinois, but this was to try to time the peak of the Texas Blue Bonnet season and to get home in time for Easter. 9 people made the trip, Rich and Melody, Rich (Stretch) and Rhonda, Pete, John and Julie, and Debbie and me.

Day one...It was 36 degrees when we left the house in the morning. We met the group and headed out. Four bikes and one car were heading to Texas to explore all we could in 14 days. Stretch and Rhonda had a bit of a conflict. Trailering their motorcycle, they planned to meet us in Texas later. Another couple had made a last-minute decision to take their car due to some medical issues. We were all happy they could still make the trip. Everyone was bundled up and had the heated gear fired up; no one complained about the cold. Rich led us down Route 24 along the river, then headed south on Route 100. These are a couple of epic area two-lane highways that follow the Illinois River. As we headed out, it felt great to return on the bike after a long Illinois winter. This time of year, the trees are still bare, but there were occasional splashes of color from the Red Buds and Magnolias blooming along the route. As we wandered through Emiquon National Wildlife Refuge, we could also spot wildlife enjoying the spring day. Ducks were swimming in the water, and an eagle watched us pass by from his perch high in the trees. Several no-till farm fields we passed today will be filled with purple flowers. Everyone was wondering what they were, and I did a quick Google search at lunch to find out. Turns out it is a weed called Henbit that grows like a ground cover. It may be a nuisance to the farmers, but it is beautiful for the traveler. Rich kept the time in the saddle down with stops every 80 miles. Since this was the first time out for most of us, it was appreciated. We eventually crossed the Mississippi into Missouri, stopping for the night after about 350 miles of traveling.

Day 2...We headed out with the heated gear on again today, 43 degrees, leaving Lebanon, Missouri, we traveled down Hwy 5 to Hwy 76. These two-lane roads provide us with some great riding, having to maintain a single file most of the time. There was fantastic scenery, and even more color was popping in the trees. Our lunch destination was Guy Fieri's in Branson. It warmed up nicely to about 60 in the afternoon. Guy's served some great food with big portions. Most of us split our meals. We took Rt 86 and Rt 23 back on the road into Eureka Springs. 86 could have been a nice two-laner, but there was too much traffic. Rt 23, on the other hand, was fantastic. This road had lots of twists and turns. Frequently following a creek on one side with rock cliffs on the other. This dumped us off right on the historic main street. We were passing through, but now I must return and spend some time there. After Eureka Springs, we planned to hit the Famous Pig Tail (Rt 23) with a quick stop at the Oak General Store, on our way to our final stop for the night, Fort Smith. Well, as is our custom, we got lost! Riding around on the twisty roads of the Arkansas Ozarks can be disorienting if you're unfamiliar with the area. No worries, though. We still got to ride some fantastic roads. We were on Route 16 and Route 21.

These roads led us about 30 miles out of the way, but it was worth it. If you are in this area, give these two roads a try. Once we got back to civilization in Clarksville, we were all beat. We hit Interstate 40 for the last leg into Fort Smith, getting there just as the sun set. The Pig Tail and Oak General Store will have to wait until another time.

Day 3...Today, our journey took us to ADA, Oklahoma, for lunch. We finally escaped the cold

weather, but now had to contend with rain. Our first hour or 2 was in and out of rain. Nothing terrible, just a nuisance. Highway 70 shot a straight line across southern Oklahoma, where the trees and forest of the Ozarks gave way to rolling pasture with many large cattle ranches. The landscape became dotted with oil wells. Some are working, and others are standing as rusting monuments to times past. I found all the small towns we went through fascinating, giving my imagination a workout thinking of their glory days. Finally making it to Texas, we stopped in Wichita Falls for the night.



Day 4...Woke up to more storms today. It rained all night, and everything was soaked. The temperature was 55 degrees. Since we were not in a hurry (keeping our daily mileage to around 300), we waited till 9:30 to get back on the road. The rain had stopped, but the skies were overcast, and the temperatures were cool. Not what we were expecting in Texas. As we headed to Kerrville, we were buffeted by high winds. The scenery was not significantly different from Oklahoma, but for Midwesterners like us, it was still enjoyable. Slowly, the skies cleared, and the temperatures improved. Rich led us into Kerrville on farm-to-market roads that took us into the hill country. Oil wells gave way to prickly pear cacti, and ranch land filled with low-growing scrub trees. The roads were in great shape with just enough curves to keep it interesting. We got our first authentic look at the Bluebonnets and Indian Paintbrush flowers that dotted the roadside everywhere. We arrived in Kerrville and settled in for the next 4 days. Some of us stayed at Rich and Melody's house while the rest remained at a local hotel.

Day 5...After 4 days on the road, this was a short day. We hung out most of the morning while waiting for the weather to warm up. Then we went on a shopping trip to Fredericksburg. This local shopping destination has many shopping opportunities on its main street. It is also home to the Admiral Nimitz Museum. There is no problem spending a whole day or two here, but we only had a few hours. After lightening our wallets, we headed to Friedhelm's Bavarian Inn for a wonderful German lunch. It was a pleasant experience with a lot of laughter and good food. After lunch, we headed out to Luckenbach, Texas, made famous in the country song. They boast a population of three. Only a few buildings are left here, but there were a lot of visitors. The only things here were a gift shop, a hat shop, an old post office, a bandstand, and an open-air dance hall. But that didn't stop us from spending a few hours here. A band played some great old country tunes, and we spent a lot of time sipping our sodas and enjoying the outdoor entertainment. Rich led us around on some great farm and ranch roads again today.

I thought about that, and I wholeheartedly agree with Dan. To that end, before I get to my usual topic of finances, I will share a very long ride story in a very short space.

I remember when Janet and I rode with another couple from Denver to Nova Scotia, including a ferry ride to Newfoundland and back. Then, we traveled back to the U.S. After a few days' visit in New York City, we proceeded south through the DelMarVa peninsula, taking the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel to Virginia. We traveled west through some southern states and the Central Plains and back to Denver. All in all, we covered about 8,500 miles in 5 weeks. Of those 8,500 miles, less than 1,000 were interstate, the balance being back or off-interstate roads. It was a joyous trip, AND we are still friends with that couple!

As many of you may know, because we are a not-for-profit organization, we have reporting requirements to the IRS. The requirement is to file an IRS Form 990N annually. This report is only available online and must be completed by May 15 for the preceding calendar year. We have 195 entities, Chapters, Districts, Regions that must file this report, and then send confirmation to the VP of Finance (that is me for now). At this writing, I have received 194 confirmations. Yes, all but one of you have reported to me. That is a 99.5% success rate, and a cause for me to celebrate a little! I thank all of you who have followed through on this requirement and sent the confirmation to me. Now, I am gearing up for next year!

Route Planning Options

GPX vs Online Mapping...

what are some options.

June is upon us, and the weather is warming up. For some, it may actually be blistering hot, and/or humid. Recently, I was on a ride, the heat was in the

90s and the humidity was in the 90s, and it took no time to get dehydrated. I even felt it into the next day, so please folks, while you are taking those rides, be sure to drink as you go. Don't just tank up on the stops (although if you don't have some other way, then by all means), but try to drink a little as you go.

Now for things more techy. Some friends and I were recently having a discussion about route planning and what is available to work with our rides. Some folks have embraced

the smart phone and use Google Maps on their phone. There are several cradles out there to support this, some even have wiring to keep the phone charged. Just make sure that smart phone is also water resilient or you have a backup plan for the rain.

What other methods are out there? For those who have the 2008 up to 2024 Goldwings, many have maps that come with the bike. Some are easier than others to upgrade, while others can be just dang difficult. There are lots of Facebook threads out there to assist you in the process, but just remember, everyone is an expert on your process.

Some of us still rely on the external Garmin GPS mapping system. **Did you know**, Garmin no longer supports Basecamp? The software is still available for download but no longer supported. Same is true for MapSource, so what does that leave us with?

With some research, you will find options, with 40 different mapping applications out there. One thing listed is Caltopo (I have not tried it yet, but if someone is using it, I would love to hear from you). From what I could

find, it is pretty robust. There is a free version and a pay version so be sure to check it out.

Next, I took a look at MyRoute-app. There is a downloadable version for your phone, or you can create GPX files for your existing Garmins (if you still use them). There is a free basic plan, with limitation or there is a subscription service, you pay monthly, yearly or a lifetime membership.

Next, I looked into Google. Now just about all smart phones now come with Google Maps, and you can easily make a route from Point A to B. Adding waypoints can be difficult, but doable. You can even tell it to avoid highways

and it will keep you on the

backroads. All sounds great, but there can be some pitfalls.

Google maps will modify your route, enroute. It will see slowdowns, wrecks, and such and will automatically modify your route, sometimes without even letting you know. That disturbs me if I've planned to see certain sights along the route.

Some people even use Waze and have great success with it. **Did you Know**, Google owns Waze, and are starting to include many of the Waze features in their Google Maps? But there are some advantages, IF, you are only using your smartphone.

So, there are some options out there, but you may still need to do some more research, to see which one works best for you. And by all means, if you have a program you enjoy, let me know. I would love to hear your story and or to share it with others on your behalf, if you don't feel like writing an article.




