

2025 Recruiting Rock Star Challenge



Region C Progressive Ride-In Making History

From September 14 to 17, Region C made history by hosting its first Progressive Ride-In, which toured through the beautiful canyon country of southwestern Utah.

Our adventure started at the Broken Spur Inn in Torrey, Utah, with the arrival of our friends and members on Sunday, September 14. Impromptu gatherings in the parking lot and waves from dinner tables set the stage for an amazing Ride-In!

On the morning of the 15th, we had breakfast, followed by the opening ceremony in a meeting room provided by the wonderful staff of the inn. We welcomed all attendees,



introduced the planning team, and processed some registrations. Riders then drew their first Poker Run Card. We were thrilled to have half of our Founders team join us, including Anita and JR Alkire, as well as a very special guest, none other than Sandy Garris! We were also joined by our Region D Directors, Chuck and Betty Bonnett, as well as CA-NV District Director Kevin Herrera. We're so glad to have such great representation from the West for the West. Chris Toomer covered some critical information on high-altitude riding, hydration/dehydration, and altitude sickness, as much of our riding was at altitudes over 4,000 feet, with some exceeding 10,000 feet.



Heading outside, we had a pre-ride meeting, broke into groups, and started on our ride to the Purple Sage Inn in Panquitch, UT (say pangwitch). We left in two groups, one with nine bikes and trikes, and the other with seven bikes and trikes. Rounding out the ride groups were 4

autos that could (and did) carry emergency hydration and first aid supplies.

The group I was with enjoyed a detour to ride through Burr

Canyon, a truly fabulous side trip that culminates at an amazing overlook, which, if continued, ends 70 miles later at a ferry on Lake Powell. The view was just beautiful. And then we got to ride it in







But the day wasn't over yet! Bryce Canyon National Park beckoned, and boy, did we answer! Parking was tight, so we decided to surround a motorhome. Bryce did not disappoint, offering stunning views and unique rock formations. Of all the places we visited, Bryce was the National Park that showed the magnificent vastness of the American West! One can start to feel small out here.



Leaving Bryce, we found ourselves on the road again to our second hotel for the trip in Panquitch, UT. Upon arrival, riders went to their hotels, with many of us staying at the Purple Sage Motel. Not knowing what to expect, we were

pleasantly surprised by the cleanliness and attention to detail in the rooms. The



staff was excellent, and check-in and check-out were a breeze! I would absolutely recommend this cute motel to travelers.



Our amazing Ride Planning Team found Cowboy's Smoke House Café/Steakhouse, where they set us up in a large back room. All of our riders joined us for dinner and the second Poker Run Card Draw. I guess everyone seemed to be happy with their draws. After all, it was only the 2nd card. Maybe you lost out on a Royal Flush, 4 of a Kind, or a Straight, but there are still some excellent hands available, including 3 of a kind, Full House, and even 2 pair, so no one gave up hope. Dinner was excellent, and even though their staff was small, they handled us with poise. Well done.

On Tuesday, the 16th, many of us returned to Cowboy's for a fantastic breakfast. Given the number of locals there, we knew we had chosen the right place. After breakfast, we had a short ride to the north end of town at a rest area on Hwy 89 for our morning briefing, ride meeting,

and the 3rd Poker Run card draw.

Not sure how others were doing, as my eyes were filled with tears, as my hopes for a full house, straight, or Flush were dashed. Off and riding again, we stopped at places with names like Chessmen Ridge Overlook and Cedar Breaks

National Park. On the way, we stumbled across some early fall colors at higher altitudes. As a



Phoenix dweller, seeing the fall colors and the leaves turning to beautiful oranges and yellows was a treat!

Our next objective was to reach the IHOP in Cedar City. We found Cedar City easily; we ran into a little difficulty locating the IHOP. At least we got the mandatory U-Turn practice in. After a great lunch with excellent service, the two riding groups met at either a Shell or Maverick station to top off their tanks and begin the afternoon leg of a very scenic ride to Kanab, UT (pronounced "kun-ab"), and their final hotel for the trip. We stopped at Point Supreme Viewpoint on our way to La Quinta Inn in Kanab. After dinner, we held a Meet and Greet in the

lobby of the Inn and had the 4th card pull; well, at least 3 of a kind or two pairs are still a possibility for me. While enjoying catching up with friends, new and old, two buses pulled in. The first was filled with high school seniors from Georgia on their senior trip, with a planned rafting excursion the next day. The other bus was filled with an Asian group touring our National Parks. So... the hotel was full, and as motorcyclists, you

know what that means: Get up and get breakfast

ASAP!!! The hotel handled breakfast admirably. They did a great job!

On Wednesday, the 17th, the final ride for

the event took place. We had breakfast in the lobby and had the final draw of the Poker Run. I'm hopeful my pair of 4s will win. We were able to hold our ride briefing in the lobby and discussed a few key safety items to remember when riding in a group. Kickstands up, we started on the final guided ride of this inaugural Ride-In. The first stop on this 130-mile day was the Checkerboard Mesa viewing area. Continuing the journey, we headed to Zion National Park and the Zion Canyon Visitor Center. Wow! Zion National Park was the ultimate culmination




these fantastic 3 days of riding. This part had some great riding areas like going through two tunnels through Zion NP, one of them being over a mile in length and opening to switchback after switchback heading to the valley floor on the way to Hurricane (say her-uh-khun. Seriously, that's how they say it.) and the Stage Coach Grill.



At this point, the plan was to return the way we came. For me, that was the plan. I made the Left turn and wanted to get ahead of the group to take a picture of them riding by. What is that saying? The best-laid plans of Mice and Men often go awry. Well, there was a turn to make, but I missed it and headed all the way to Tocqueville and I-15. So, I did a second U-turn; I guess it's only fair, since I was on four wheels. I found the missed turn and tried to catch up with the group. Finally, I arrived at the Inn. That night, being the cheap skate I am, I decided to walk to the dinner spot. I am glad I did. The city of Kanab, located along the main street between the Inn and the restaurant, features small story signs about the various movies and TV series filmed in and around Kanab, as well as the famous actors who stayed in the area. People like Chuck Connors, John Wayne, and a little-known figure in history, Ronald Reagan.

After dinner, we held the closing ceremony in the lobby of the Inn and announced the winners of the Poker Run. My pair of 4s wasn't enough. We also had a 50/35/15 draw that night. The planning group was introduced again. I took a few minutes to recognize these awesome people who made my anxiety disappear with their excellent preparation for the first-ever Region C Progressive-In through southwestern Utah's beautiful canyon country. I would like to recognize the team here. Planning the guided rides and much of the rest of the ride was handled by Victor Wheeler, CO-UT District Director, and Don Kuellmer, CA SRC. They planned the rides, taking us through this truly awesome area. Dave Flitcraft, Region C Treasurer, who processed the incoming registration forms, handling all of the monies, and expertly handled on-site registrations. Another big help who kept us on track and actually presented the idea of a progressive Ride-In was Chris Toomer, Vice President of Operations, overseeing Region C and D. But the most important members of this Progressive Ride-In were the members who joined us on this first-ever attempt in Region C and trusted us to deliver a memorable experience. Without your enthusiasm, this would not have been as successful as it was. Thanks again to the planning team, and a very big thank you to you, the members.



As we all rode back to our homes or to the next great adventure, thoughts turned to what the next great progressive ride-in would be in the great Western part of this beautiful country.

The Lighter Side of Motorcycling

Olympic Sports, Part 2

Last time, I presented a Skill-based event, Donning and Doffing Rain Gear. I also shared a Strength event, Right the Motorcycle. Let's see what the Endurance & Skill combined category has in store for our hopeful Olympians. As before, the concepts of *athletes* will be represented simply by *Riders*, *Co-Riders*, *and Competitors*.

Endurance & Skill

Program the GPS – Multiple Classes of this Event, including Harley-Davidson, Indian, Adventure, Scooter, Garmin Zumo, and others, each of which will be scored independently. All work the same.

Goldwing Class. This one will surely test even the most experienced riders. This event offers competitions for Rider, Rider + Co-Rider, and Team (think group ride) categories. A suitable motorcycle from the 2005 to 2008 model year range, equipped with a Honda GPS, will be provided to each Rider or Team. In all events, Riders and Co-Riders start from a standing position off the bike in full gear, including gloves.

A call of "Go! Go! Go!" starts the timer. Competitors must open an envelope provided that has the destination programmed into the GPS. Once programming is complete, Competitors must mount the motorcycle and follow the GPS to the destination. For Team events, the Team must always stay together in a staggered or single-file formation. Teams can earn (or lose) style points for exceptional (or sloppy) riding. All Competitors who deviate from the GPS route will incur substantial time penalties.



The destination will be a restaurant setting with Stations, of course! Upon arrival, Competitors will remove their helmets and be required to claim a table and chair(s). Competitors will pick up a plate at their chosen seat and head to any Station and place that Station's food item on their plate or otherwise carry it. Competitors may return to their seats to drop off food and grab an empty plate. All Stations must be visited. Finally, exit the restaurant and mount the motorcycle. A Kickstand Up will stop the timer.



Missing a Station, spilling food, or mounting your bike with less than full gear will incur time and/or style penalties. For Teams, only the last kickstand-up will stop the timer. Did I mention there will be soup, drinks, dessert, and other challenging food items? To increase the challenge, some Stations may run out of food and must restock, causing a delay. Plan your Station visits accordingly...

The Lighter Side of Motorcycling is all about exploring the silly, funny, and ridiculous sides of riding. You never know what might show up here for you to ponder... Until next time, Ride Safe, and Ride Smart!

First Aid / CPR

At home or on the road - are you prepared????

Checklist

Oh, don't we just love these numbered "things" on a piece of paper?

However, you must admit that we cannot always rely on our memory to verify these items. At the grocery store, the car maintenance records, the "honey-do" lists are useless if we don't write them down!

With that being noted, let's discuss the checklists for safety on our bikes and in everyday life.

CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and first aid are good practices to follow in our everyday lives. There are numerous scenarios in which we need to be aware of this practice of refreshing ourselves with these skills.

We get on this 1000-pound motorcycle and head out for our next destination. Full safety gear, and I hope to review your checklist. Are your tires inflated to the proper pressure? In certain climates, this can change if the bike is not ridden in a few days or even sooner; the windshield can become smeared with bugs from the last ride, and the list goes on.

Our very essential note of current CPR and 1st Aid training can be life-saving for another rider or your own family. As EWMA members, you can get this information free of charge from Certified EWMA volunteer instructors. It's a few hours of valuable information that will follow you. Several organizations offer these courses for a surprisingly high fee. They are available to you at your convenience, and an instructor is available at no additional cost. We limit the class size to 10 students per instructor to provide each student with individualized attention. First Aid comes naturally to many of us, having children and dealing with those scraped knees and a bloody mouth from a tooth falling out, but we go a bit deeper than that.

Should the need arise to render care to someone in need, we can prepare you for that fast action.

Please consider taking a course when offered. It could save a friend's life or your own.

You are protected by the Good Samaritan Law, regardless of how the incident is resolved. It offers legal protection from liability to individuals who voluntarily provide reasonable assistance to a person in an emergency. If you are uncomfortable in the situation, you can at least call 911 for help.

Hand Signals

Needed in Today's Group Riding

Hand Signals while riding has been a topic for a while now.

We were at a meeting, and everyone was trying to figure out how to communicate with every rider on a group ride, regardless of bike type. Sena, mesh, Cardo, CB are all excellent ideas, as long as everyone in the group has the same communication system, perhaps even the same bike.

All our recent bikes Renae and I have had CBs, and now Bluetooth headsets. What did we use before there were CBs? What happens when there is an error CB or headsets take a dive? On our older bike, the CB went out; what did we do? We switched back to hand signals. The one constant that is on all bikes that can be used to communicate is Hand Signals.

When using hand signals -

Let's use the same signals – we are working on a one-pager for Ride Leaders to use at the pre-Ride Meeting.

Every member of the group needs to pass the Hand Signals to the Rider behind them. If you are in a group of 9 to 11 bikes, the last bikes will not be able to see the Ride Leader or his Hand Signals.

Ride Leaders – when pulling up to a stop and before proceeding, make sure you can see the tail before leaving the stop. This is good practice whether you use electronic communication or hand signals. Always good for the Ride Leader to know where the entire group is before leaving the stop.

Since we have had CBs on our recent bikes, I must admit that I have not used hand signals all the time. Our plan is to use more hand signals. Perhaps not all of them, but the basic – Left & Right Turn, Stop, Speed Up, Single & Double File or staggered. Hand Signal between groups is "Cops Ahead" – which we have seen while out riding in a Group.

Looking forward to meeting everyone down the road!
