# Possibility of a good recruiting location!

With the upcoming "recruiting season" for EWMA on the horizon, the question is often asked, where is a good possible recruiting location? When we speak of recruiting new members, we need to know where we might find people who'd be interested in joining us. The best answer is where fellow motorcyclists gather, obviously. We need access to possible new members who would make a good "fit" in our association and, more importantly, would want to join us.

To increase our chances of meeting the right people, it should be a location where we would have our own motorcycles with us. It's always easier to approach a fellow rider when he/she can see that we are riders too. With that in mind, the best chance (other than a dedicated motorcycle event) is at a large gas station. Especially a large gas station that is located away from heavy urban traffic and ideally near rural riding areas and roads. All motorcyclists need two things: food and fuel.

Most Wa-WA's, Race Trac's, Speedway's etc., have fast food sales inside with some limited seating for folks who are eating. Take a few members of your Chapter, bring some recruiting supplies, and stop for lunch while out on a Chapter ride. Set up at one of the tables and see who comes along. If some motorcyclists happen to pull in, start sizing up the situation for a possible recruitment ambush. Always remember our guideline on new members, "like-minded."

You're not going to get them all by any means. Nan and I have recruited lots of EWMA members from gas stations as we've described above. But believe me, we've struck out many times. Try not to let it discourage you. Don't be afraid of changing up your strategy if it isn't working for you. New members are our future lifeblood, so it's vitally important to bring them in.

Happy New Year sounds a bit trite at this time! But the exciting thing is that the IRS has opened access to its 990-N filing system! You probably think my life is boring for me to be excited about such an event. On the contrary! In addition to providing the



Financial Report Spreadsheet each year, I am really busy this time of year trying to get every 990-N documented!

As a not-for-profit organization, we are under the microscope of the IRS. Their regulations require us to document each year that we are doing what we are supposed to be doing regarding our income. They do this via the 990-N program. Is it a big deal? Not really. At least not until one of our Chapters, Districts, or Regions don't comply with the regulation. No one wants to receive a letter from the IRS, and faithfully submitting our 990-Ns assures we do not hear from the IRS.

It takes only a few minutes for an individual to file a 990-N with the IRS. Then, it takes another few minutes to wait for the status to change from Pending to Accepted and another few minutes to save the accepted documentation to a PDF and email it to me. Properly documented, it makes my job a lot easier, and I appreciate all the good folks out there helping me do my job!

So, with all that said, please do all you can to have your 990-N filed and a confirmation sent to me by March 1, 2025. If everyone does so, then my job of tracking over 200 of these transactions will be complete!

Regarding due dates, every Chapter, District, and Region should complete their 2024 Financial Report and forward it to the appropriate Director or, in the case of Regions, to me. Finally, the 2025 Financial Report Spreadsheet is now uploaded and available to download from our website.

# 1st on the scene

First Aid / CPR

Scott's Survival Story
CPR Saves Lives
By: Joy Mattson - Minnesota

As the story was told to me, Scott had collapsed at his desk while talking with a co-worker from a local body shop. Right away, Chris yelled that there was a problem. 911 was activated while Wayne was found. In the meantime, other co-workers and Scott's boss, Kerry (seated to the right of Scott), moved Scott to a larger, uncluttered area of the department, and Wayne (standing behind Scott) started CPR. This all happened within 2 – 3 minutes. Several individuals in the Parts Department played a large part in the events of that day. Chris is in Scott's office and calls out the issue; Wayne is in the area and performing CPR; the other co-workers each played a role in the execution of saving Scott's life. The EMTs arrived within about 6 minutes and took over the life-saving mission. They had to shock Scott not once but twice and once again on the way to the hospital.

# At home or on the road - are you prepared????



When I arrived at the ER, I was told that Scott had suffered full cardiac arrest and respiratory failure, but he was stable thanks to the teamwork at his dealership. After a few pictures of his heart, Scott was admitted to the Cardiac Care Unit. After a consult with the Head Cardiologist, I was allowed to see Scott in his room – wow, just wow – the machines! What a great team in CCU......I have a ton of respect for every one of them! Things progressed rather well once Scott was in the CCU. After a week, he was moved to ICU. There was a great moment when they removed his breathing tube and then a setback when they asked him to cough hard.......After another few days in the ICU, he was moved to the Heart and Vascular Area, where they started PT and getting him up and walking around. He stayed in the H&V area for two weeks and then was moved to a rehab center, where he stayed for an additional two weeks.

All in total, it was 6 weeks, and Scott was able to come home. I thank GOD for his coworkers and their knowledge of CPR! Had it not been for that, Scott wouldn't be with us today. CPR saved his life!! And, if you're wondering.... yes, the dealership is continuing to do CPR and First Aid Courses to keep everyone current.

Later, there was a Heart Saver Program through the American Heart Association, where those who had saved Scott's life were presented with lunch and Heart Saver Awards. This group of individuals is now known as "The Team."

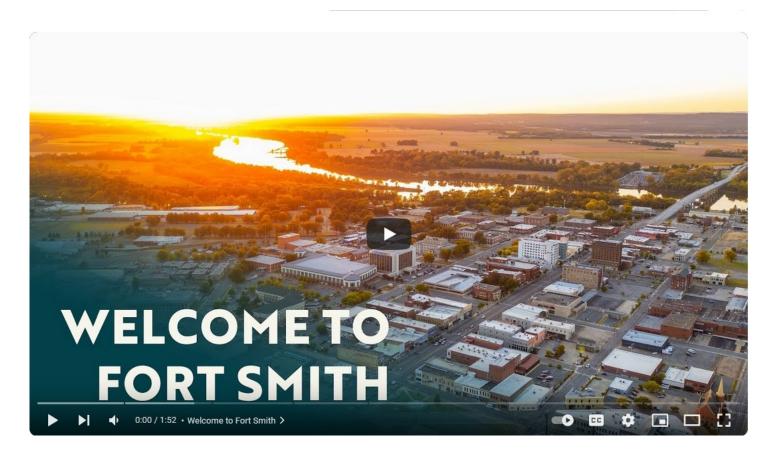

From their national website, "Our main mission is to attend the funeral services of fallen American heroes as invited guests of the family. Each mission we undertake has two basic objectives:

We accomplish the latter through strictly legal and non-violent means."

So, you ask, "How do they work, and can I be part of it?"

Families are referred to the group by a Funeral Director, word of mouth, or previous exposure like PGR attendance at the Honor Flights. Families can also contact us through our website <a href="www.Patriotguard.org">www.Patriotguard.org</a> and then they work directly with the family, the funeral home, the military and other organizations to provide exactly what the family wants.

An Interesting Summer
Rich to the Rescue

It has been a very interesting summer going to all the rallies and ride-ins for EWMA. We have met a lot of old friends, but better yet made a lot of new friends as well. When you go on an adventure you never know what you are going to encounter – good or bad. It is always good to know that you ride with people you can count on when things don't go quite your way.

Sue T. and I (from Iowa) met up in Colorado this summer at the International Ride-in. We rode many good rides and had a lot of fun over the two days. It was so much fun that we stayed an extra day to do some additional riding. We left Colorado and it was very, very hot going through Colorado and Nebraska. We were riding in 105+ degrees and trying to stay hydrated and alert. It was so bad we only covered 250 miles as I just wasn't feeling well enough to ride. The next morning we got up early and decided to try and make it all the way home. We made it to Des Moines, IA (2 hours from home for Sue and 3 for me) and felt that we could make it the rest of the way even though it was 95+ degrees the whole way. We had stopped regularly and hydrated with electrolytes and water. We hit Des Moines in rush hour traffic and things started to slow down. Only Sue was overcome by heat and didn't slow down and hit the car in front of her. She was dazed and seriously bruised but nothing broken. 911 was called and I called my husband Rich. He said to stay in a hotel close by and he would bring the trailer the next day to take the trike and Sue on to Cedar Rapids. He showed up early and we loaded the trike (bent forks and frame) onto the trailer and got Sue home to Cedar Rapids. It is because of EWMA that I was with Sue that day.

So we move on to the Region E Ride-in in Anamosa, IA a month later. We were out for a beautiful ride and crossed over from Iowa to Illinois and stopped at a gas station. We had a two wheel Harley that suddenly had no power when we went to resume our ride. All the guys gathered around and tried various things to get it running to no avail. We sent the rest of the group on the ride and a couple of us stayed back to help. Once again I called Rescue Rich (much closer to home this time – 10 miles) and he hooked up the trailer and came to the rescue. We loaded the bike on the trailer and got it to a mechanic who changed the battery, then discovered a nail in the tire. This time this was a couple I had just met as they are new to EWMA. We were glad to help and ensure that they could get back on the road quickly and safely.

The benefits of EWMA are never ending in many ways. It does not matter if it is old friends or new friends, we help each other out in time of need.

# "Built it and they will come"



There has been a ton of discussion lately about how to recruit new members into our organization. Some of our executives have been asking me how our chapter, BC-A in Vancouver, manages to keep bringing in new members. I am reminded of a saying - "build it and they will come".

First, a bit of history: Chapter BC-A has been around for over 45 years. We were the first GWRRA chapter to form in Canada and one of the first to sign on with EWMA. We have over 90 current members, not all active but members, nonetheless. How do we do it?

As a chapter in the former organization, we were considered "black sheep" near the end. We broke the rules and did our own things but kept growing. It didn't matter what anybody rode, we didn't care if you wore a vest or patch, as long as you rode in a safe and respectful manner when with the group. That still stands today. I think the median age of our group is around 60 yrs of age. We have several members in their 20's and 30's, several well into their 70's, and even a few in their 80's. Almost everyone rides. Our oldest member, Heinz, just purchased a brand new Harley and was seen last summer as far south as Vegas, riding solo and having a blast!

We meet three times a week (Saturday and Sunday mornings and Tuesday evenings) for coffee and welcome strangers to join us if they come asking about our bikes. Sometimes we ride, sometimes we don't, it depends on the weather. Above all, we are respectful and friendly with all who show up. We have had complete strangers come along for a ride; by the end of the day, they are members. It isn't about the benefits advertised on our website or the structure and purpose of our organization; it is about getting together with likeminded people and having fun. Those other things are just the icing on the cake.

We meet for breakfast monthly and keep the meetings short so we can get an early start for a ride if the weather is good. We hold a 50/50 draw at each meeting and the funds raised cover our charter fees and then some. No games, just great conversation about past rides, maybe some technical stuff, and what is coming up. This past month, we had over 22 members show up for breakfast. Sometimes, we only get 4-5; other times, we may have 30 show up. We never fret about it, as we know not everybody has a similar schedule. That is why we offer so many different opportunities to meet and ride.

We have a website (<a href="https://chapterbca.org">https://chapterbca.org</a>) and a Facebook group (it is private to keep the spammers away - <a href="https://www.facebook.com/groups/847571141961760">https://www.facebook.com/groups/847571141961760</a>) that are both kept current and relative. We also have a WhatsApp chat group that gets lots of action from the members. We also get together every Thursday evening on Zoom. It is a leftover from pandemic times, but everyone still enjoys the conversation.

Our chapter team meets occasionally to plan future events, usually over dinner/lunch at someone's home. We try to have at least one organized group ride each month centered on getting the members out with their wives/partners (couples rides). We organize overnight rides on long weekends in the summer months. This summer, we are heading down to Crater Lake, Oregon, for a 4 day run over the July long weekend. Last year, we rode down to Mt St Helens and back up the Olympic Peninsula. These events are well attended, usually attracting 15-20 bikes, with many couples coming.

In a nutshell, we are just a bunch of friendly, like-minded individuals who like to ride. We are open to anybody who asks about us and what we do, and they are always welcome.

It does take some work and dedication, but we always make it fun. I hope this may help some chapters that seem to be struggling. Don't be scared to break the mold and try different things.

Last month we did a recap of the previous year's articles. Hopefully, you found that informative. I've been told I talk to much, so I'm going to try a slightly different approach. With this article, I'm going to introduce sections, with some directions, to assist you in navigating our website. Remember, to get the full value of the website, you must login. If you have any difficulties, please contact me and we will assist.

### **Admin Access for Directors**

I'll start with some info for the "Directors", which may also include Assistants. Directors, you should all be an admin for your functional area. If you don't see the "Control Panel" words at the top right of your screen, once you login, contact me. We have a boo boo (although very rare, but they do exist).

Did you know, we can make your officers admin for these areas also? Yes, with an email from the Director, I will give them admin access also. Now, what does that mean?

Chapter Directors who are admins for their chapters, will receive an email from our system, each time a member in their chapter makes a change. Specifically, when they renew, expire, join or leave the chapter. This keeps you in the know, and gives you the ability to reach out to them if it looks like they may have missed our notice to them.

This admin status also gives you the ability to add members to your chapter, to show up as members. The September 2024 OTF article has detailed instructions on this, so I won't repeat them. Just a reminder.

# **Uses for the Eagle Book**

your organizational level is joined in a chapter? Easy, use the Eagle Book. This applies to each director level. Now, at the Region level, it is easier to use the Member Roster to determine this, because of the quantity of people, but the Eagle Book offers other info.

How many people joined EWMA in your functional area? The Eagle Book can tell you that for any new members. You can select under the "Recent Membership" a specific date range, to include Last 10, 30, 60 or 90 days.

If you are looking for a specific area, use the selections on the right side of the panel



Search for members by entering criteria above

(Country, State, and/or Zip Code). DO NOT make selections on the left side, unless you know all the people are in a chapter. Since we have turned this feature on and made it mandatory, all renewals now require the primary member to select a chapter, so this will be resolved soon.

For example. If you want to see all the new members in Alabama, you would select the following:

Country: United States of America

State: Alabama
City: leave blank

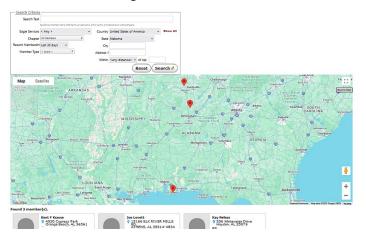
Address 1: leave blank

Within (any distance) of zip: Your choice.

Once you click on the "Search" button, it will display everyone in that region.

Now, to narrow down the new members, using the previous search information, on the left side choose "**Recent Membership**": (Pick a range).

As of the writing of this article, with the Last 30



days selected, there were three new members in Alabama.

The info below the map will also include the contact information for each person, giving you the ability to reach out and welcome them.

Region Directors can use similar settings for their region by picking a zip code. Just a reminder, the max distance is 75 miles from a selected zip code.
